

RULES GOVERNING THE ELECTION OF A MINOR

1. A student may elect a minor in a department only if the Catalogue lists a minor for that department.
2. A minimum of five courses, at least three points each, from a department outside the major will constitute a minor. No overlapping will be permitted.
3. The courses must be passed with a letter grade of C- or higher; D's will not be counted toward the minor.
4. At least three of the minimum five courses must be qualifying Barnard or Columbia courses
5. A minor will not be recorded until all relevant courses are satisfactorily completed.
6. Any previous P's in courses to be counted toward the minor will be converted when the minor is put on the transcript.
7. The courses for the minor must be approved by the chair of the department, and the yellow copy must be filed with the department chair.
8. Courses for the minor may also be used for general education requirements. For students matriculating before September 2000, two of the courses may be used towards general requirements.

ART HISTORY MINOR

The minor in Art History consists of five lecture courses, including BC 1001, BC 1002, and three courses in the following areas, of which one must be non-European:

European and American: Ancient, Medieval, Renaissance, Baroque, and Modern

Non-European: Chinese, Japanese, Indian, African, Mesoamerican, and Native American

REQUIREMENTS FOR THE ECONOMICS MINOR

The minor in economics requires five courses, including an introductory course in economics, BC 3033 or BC 3035, and three electives, one of which has an intermediate micro- or macroeconomic theory course as a prerequisite.

EDUCATION:

The minor requires a minimum of six courses:

a methods course (EDUC BC2052, BC2053)

EDUC BC2055 Urban School Practicum

EDUC BC3063 Student Teaching in Urban Schools

EDUC BC3064 Seminar in Issues in Urban Teaching

two others from those courses listed under the Childhood or Adolescence Program but not counted toward the major, such as Science in the City BC3050x.

REQUIREMENTS FOR THE POLITICAL SCIENCE MINOR

A total of five courses are necessary to complete a minor, including one or more of the introductory courses or approved equivalents (see above). Four of these courses must be taken from courses listed in the political science section of the Barnard catalogue. Only one course taken in a summer session, study-abroad program, Reid Hall Program, or another undergraduate college may be used to satisfy the five-course requirement for the minor, with the approval of Professor Kimberly Marten, our Department Chair.

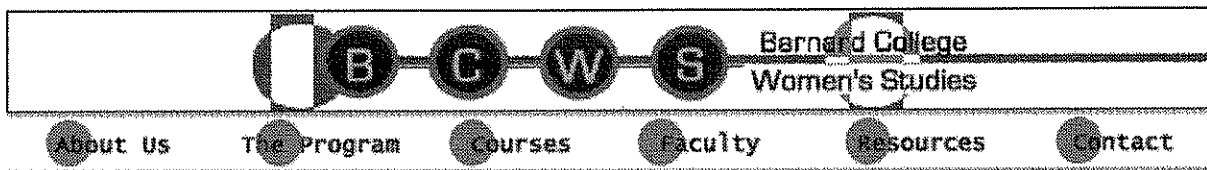
SOCIOLOGY MINOR

5 courses are required for the minor in Sociology, including SOC BC 1003 [INTRODUCTION TO SOCIOLOGY] and four courses to be selected in consultation with the Sociology adviser.

SPANISH AND LATIN AMERICAN CULTURES

Minor in Spanish and Latin American Cultures. Six courses (minimum 18 points): SPAN 3300, SPAN 3330, SPAN 3349 or 3350, and three other courses at 3000-level or above to be chosen in consultation with the major advisor.

For students wishing to pursue a more rigorously interdisciplinary program in the Social Sciences or the Humanities, the Department offers a major that integrates courses in Spanish and Latin American Cultures/Spanish and Portuguese with courses in another department or program chosen carefully by the student.]
